

The European Alliance for Value in Health is a group of associations representing stakeholders active in the broader European health systems





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

In the view of the Alliance, value-based, sustainable and people-centred health systems are built around six key principles

Resources are allocated towards high value care and prevention, with outcomes and costs of care measured holistically



Innovative ways of care delivery are fostered




Continuous learning, education and healthcare improvement is based on evidence, and supported by data and insights




Financing models and payments reward value and outcomes

Value-based, person-centred health systems...


Investing in prevention, early detection and intervention, including through more holistic financing models

Measuring and collecting outcomes that matter for people and patients, including PROs, for feedback and benchmarking

Integrated care models, including through home-care and telemedicine

Patient empowerment through increased health literacy, digital tools and access to health data – patient as co-producer of care

Rapid evaluation and uptake of beneficial innovation that improves value



...leads to improved health system resilience

Healthier population and lower incidence of chronic diseases improves vulnerabilities to health threats

Real-time feedback on outcomes for different population and patient groups helps evaluate public health measures

Patients that can receive care at home or in community reduces pressure on hospitals

Informed patients can better manage their own health in a disruptive situation

Innovative solutions (organisational, services, products) can help health systems cope with a crisis



Recommendations



Incentivise and invest in health promotion & prevention, early detection & intervention and rehabilitation



Review and reform the framework for health budgeting to enable a holistic approach to health financing



Adopt national strategies for the routine collection of standardised data on health outcomes and patient experience for real-time feedback and learning



Ensure agile and future-proof regulatory frameworks to assess and adopt innovation that brings value



Address legislative, organisational and financial barriers to implement telehealth and digital health solutions, including remote monitoring and care



Empower and resource patient organisations so that they can help guide health system transformation, enable patient-centred decision-making and support vulnerable patient communities in a crisis.



Build cross-stakeholder coalitions to align and drive reform towards value-based and person-centred healthcare
